

Resolution 2016-1. Membership categories.

WHEREAS the board of directors of Cascadian Bowmen of Eugene is charged with the responsibility of establishing membership classes and membership tiers and annual dues under Article III of the bylaws; and

WHEREAS the board deems it to be in the best interest of the club to establish a category of corporate membership that is distinct from corporate sponsorship; and

WHEREAS the board wishes to recognize the contribution to the general community of first responders, veterans, and active military;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby establishes the following membership classes, tiers, and dues:

A. Membership Classes.

- Household (anyone age 18 and over as of June 1, all immediate family members and children attending school full-time until their 21st birthday).
- Junior (anyone under age 18 as of June 1, who is joining the club as a head-of-household)
- Honorary (persons who have demonstrated outstanding contributions to archery, who are specifically recognized by a 2/3 vote of the Cascadian Bowmen Board of Directors).
- Longevity (15+ years)
- Out-of-area (at least 50 miles from club property).
- Limited Must possess a physical impairment that limits use of the facilities to the indoor range, practice range, or Cougar trail (wheel-chair accessible trail).
- Guest \$5 cash per visit, to the maximum number of visits specified in the bylaws, payable in the cash box in the indoor range.
- Corporate. A corporation may hold up to 6 memberships on behalf of employees.
- First responders, veterans, and active military (fire-fighters, police officers, and veterans or active military with proof of service).

B. Membership Tiers.

1. Full working member. Households in good standing who completed at least 16 hours of service during the prior membership year.
2. Partial working members: Households in good standing who completed 8-15 hours of service during the prior membership year.
3. Complementary members: All current members of the Board of Directors, the Oregon Safari Coordinator, and such other positions as the directors may approve in the Minutes.

C. Dues are for all or part of the 12-month period starting June 1.

D. The following classes do not have service hour requirements or membership tiers:

Veterans; active military, fire or police personnel (must provide documentation)	\$100	\$50	\$125
Individual / Household (anyone age 18 and over as of June 1; a married couple and their children attending school full-time until their 21st birthday)	See below	See below	See below

E. For first-time members, only, dues are pro-rated for Individuals / Head of Household, as follows:

Application month	June - Nov	Dec - Feb	March-May (includes dues for NEXT year)
No service hours during the <i>previous</i> membership year.	\$200	\$100	\$250
8-15 volunteer hours per household during the <i>previous</i> membership year	\$150	\$75	\$190
16 or more volunteer hours per household during the <i>previous</i> membership year	\$100	\$50	\$125

F. Gate card.

- Only one gate card will be issued per household.
- Households must pay a \$30 deposit on the gate card.
- The \$30 will be returned when the gate card is returned to the Membership Director.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution shall be sent to all club members at their last known physical or email address, and posted on the Cascadian Bowmen website.

This resolution was adopted by the board of directors on April 6, 2016, and shall be effective on April 7, 2016.
